our quality indices

- Many USZ and most Birth Center staff choose to have their babies with us.
- We are the Birth Center of choice for many women's health doctors from surrounding hospitals.
- Our Center has the lowest rates of high-degree perineal tears, urinary catheter infection and blood transfusion in Switzerland.
- No Swiss center has so many specialists in fetomaternal medicine.

Do we never make mistakes?

No. But we deal with them openly and do everything we can to drive quality continuously forward. This includes systematic team debriefing after all births, an anonymized reporting system for problem cases and interdisciplinary review of special situations. Team timeouts before each operative procedure help prevent mistakes being made in the first place.

our expertise

- 3000 deliveries per year make us the largest Birth Center in German-speaking Switzerland.
- While most expectant mothers come to us for a normal birth, many also come from other parts of Switzerland and our neighbors because they need our expertise.
- In the Perinatal Medicine Center we and our neonatology colleagues look after high-risk expectant mothers who give birth prematurely.
- In the Prenatal Diagnostics and Therapy Center we and specialist colleagues from the Children's Hospital take care of those babies in need of medical help while still inside their mother's womb.
- We are the largest European center for the operative repair of spina bifida in the womb, putting a life in which they are able to walk within the reach of affected children.
- We are one of the three Swiss centers performing intrauterine laser surgery for the complications of multiple pregnancy.





We operate as a team

 We conduct childbirth care on a team basis, headed by the midwife in uncomplicated cases and, where risk is involved, by a tailored team of obstetricians, midwives, neonatologists, anesthesiologists and specialists in adult medicine.

We foster the next generation

- We're forever hosting the next generation of practitioners, whether destined to become heads of department, primary care physicians, midwives or nurses.
- Juniors in all these groups receive clearly structured supervision 24/7 from an experienced specialist.
- Drills aren't confined to fire stations. We too use simulation in teamwork training because it's what makes the difference in emergencies.



our infrastructure

Our medical equipment is the best of its kind, whether for ultrasound or for monitoring childbirth.

Our 40-year-old wards could admittedly do with a facelift but every room enjoys magnificent views. Our staff's professionalism and personal approach are more important than 5-star luxury. At the end of the day they are what count.

For all those for whom their child's safety is paramount:

Our neonatology unit is located right next to the Birth Center and can take care of your child within seconds if necessary.

Individual daily routine and visiting times

We allow for the notorious overlap between day and night in the early postnatal period by providing a breakfast buffet from 7.30 am through 9.45 am. We've also introduced a 'Don't disturb' period between 12.15 pm and 1.00 pm to help mother and child recover from the stress of the preceding days free of all staff intervention except if medically indicated.

Visiting times on the labor and postnatal wards are from 1 pm through 8 pm daily. Our private beds welcome visitors 24/7.



24/7 Care

Experienced midwives, doctors and nurses with specialist qualifications in obstetrics and neonatology are in the Birth Center day and night. In critical cases the senior obstetrician or his deputy can be on site within 15 minutes. For us, the key lies in good teamwork. Nothing else enables us to act as fast or with such purpose in complex, extreme and potentially life-threatening situations

Outpatient Clinic

You're in good hands in our general Outpatient Clinic. It's where the many women with uncomplicated pregnancies see a doctor or midwife. The Breastfeeding Clinic caters for those with questions about their child's nutrition or who need feeding advice. We also offer specialist consultations with a range of experts in fetomaternal medicine:

- Problem Pregnancy Clinic (for expectant mothers with such conditions as diabetes, cancer, or congenital heart disease)
- Twin and Multiple Pregnancy Clinic
- Specialist Ultrasound and Prenatal Diagnostic Clinic
- Genetics Clinic
